Dear Parishioners and friends,

First and foremost, be assured of my prayers. These are troubling times, and I am saddened by the necessary changes we have had to make to protect our parishioners. I ask Mary, our Mother and Queen, to accompany us on this unprecedented journey to the Cross. Remember, in the words of St Augustine, "We are Easter People and Alleluia is our song." We must continue to be people of hope. We must continue to be the Face of Jesus. We must continue to be Resurrection-People.

Further to recent Federal Government announcements regarding COVID-19 and directives issued by the Archdiocese of Sydney, we advise that all places of worship will not be available for masses or private prayer. Therefore all masses and gatherings such as Stations of the Cross, prayer groups, Holy Hour, Rosary sessions and other communal devotions, inside or outside, have been suspended until further notice.

During this time, you are welcome to make an act of Spiritual Communion:

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Blessed Sacrament.

I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul.

Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already here, and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen

In addition, I am seeking to live stream the Mass on Facebook ([link](#)) and YouTube ([link](#)). Alternatively you can watch Mass online or on Channel 10 on Sundays at 6am or later in the day on 10Play (see details in the Parish Notices below on Page 3 as well as other links to prayers, music, stations of the Cross and ideas for a sacred space).

Details regarding Sacraments are found on Page 2 of the Bulletin. Funerals can still be held with a maximum of 10 people in attendance seated according to the places marked on the pews and subject to physical distancing, hygiene and related directives.

THESE CHANGES ARE EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.

Important notice: All laypeople are dispensed from attending Sunday Mass: the faithful can keep Sunday holy by setting aside some time for prayer at home, reading the Scriptures of the day (found on Page 4 of the Bulletin), watching Mass on television or online, and/or asking God for the graces they would normally receive in Holy Communion. Though our priests can no longer celebrate Mass *with* their people, they can and should celebrate Mass *for* their people on their behalf.

Sacraments

- **Baptism:** To be postponed if prudent, unless in the case of an emergency. Please contact the Parish Office to make prior booking. Subject to physical distancing, hygiene and related directives.
- **Marriage:** Couples need to provide at least six months' notice and a preparation course is required. During this time, only the couple and 2 witnesses are able to attend and subject to physical distancing, hygiene and related directives.
- **Reconciliation:** The faithful are advised on the continuing importance of examination of conscience and making an act of contrition; though the Sacrament of Reconciliation is currently not available to parishioners.

Sacramental Program 2020

The Sacramental Program for all sacraments has been postponed. No alternative scheduling is possible at this stage for First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion or Confirmation. We will endeavour to update you as direction is received from the Archdiocese. Thank you for your commitment to your children's faith journeys and for your patience with this situation facing us all.

Gospel (Shorter Form)

Jn 11:3-7. 17. 20-27. 33-45
A reading from the holy Gospel according to John
I am the resurrection and the life

The sisters Martha and Mary sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.' Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judaea.'

Upon arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said: 'I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die.'

Do you believe this?' 'Yes, Lord,' she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.' Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said, 'See how much he loved him!' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?' Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening. Jesus said, 'Take the stone away.' Martha said to him, 'Lord, by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.' Jesus replied, 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said: 'Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer. I knew indeed that you always hear me, but I speak for the sake of all these who stand round me, so that they may believe it was you who sent me.'

When he had said this, he cried in a loud voice, 'Lazarus, here! Come out!' The dead man came out, his feet and hands bound with bands of stuff and a cloth round his face. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, let him go free.' Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary and had seen what he did believed in him.

'Jesus wept' is the shortest verse in the New Testament. Just two little words carry a world of emotion and speak volumes about Jesus. Pope Leo I used this verse to highlight the two natures of Jesus, pointing out that in his humanity, Jesus wept for the death of his friend, but in his divinity Jesus raised Lazarus to life. All three readings for this Sunday, as well as the psalm response, point out our inability to raise ourselves out of the deaths that afflict us. Acknowledging human propensity to sin, Paul credits the Spirit of God with transforming death into life. Finally, it is Jesus who calls Lazarus out of the grave and returns him to his life. We can see that God does not leave us to languish in our various deaths. Instead, God offers us new life out of the tombs. All of this is accomplished through the mercy and compassion of God.
