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## A Message from Fr Joseph

Today's readings open with a great vision of the Prophet Isaiah: "Console my people", says your God.

He is like a shepherd feeding us, gathering and holding in His arms." Then in the Psalm: "Kindness and truth shall meet..." and finally, to the Gospel with John proclaiming: "Make straight the paths of the Lord."

All the readings seem to be specifically crafted to address the reality of our world today. These readings can assist us as we are preparing our hearts to welcome Jesus into our Advent. If the events in our world are causing you grief and anxiety, read and reread the opening lines from Isaiah about comfort. So many of us need comfort right now with Covid-19; fear about losing families, homes and work. These are chaotic, uncertain times and we know the only true strength in our life is the peace that comes from God. What do we need to do to stay grounded in God so that we can give comfort to others and not add to their unease and worries? In the gospel, Mark describes how people from the countryside and Jerusalem "were traveling to have John baptize them..."

as they acknowledged their sins."

What are my sins that I need to acknowledge during this Advent season? What barriers do I need to dismantle so I can prepare my heart for Jesus'? What is preventing me from becoming someone who can "organize a world according to God's heart"?

John was very clear about what his role was: "I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." John was preparing the world for Jesus, our Redeemer. Instead of capitalizing on his newfound 'fame', John humbly continued to fulfil the mission given to him. John helps me realize that I don't have to do everything, I just need to do my part. I hope you can take comfort from today's readings. Sit with them and let them speak to you.

Maybe you'll find that during this Advent season, we can all move towards becoming "...the new human being society needs. The Christian knows that Christ has been working in humanity for twenty centuries and that the person that is converted to Christ is the new human being that society needs to organize a world according to God's heart." St. Oscar Romero

### Jacaranda Trees


When driving around the suburb can you spot any Jacaranda Trees?

## Gospel

**Mk 1:1-8**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

*Make straight the paths of the Lord.*

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight, and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by



him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

## Reflection by Greg Sunter

The gospel of Mark is sometimes portrayed as a 'no fuss' gospel. Nowhere is this more clearly seen than in this week's passage. We have the first eight verses of the gospel and the author wastes no time in announcing the purpose, 'The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God.' The gospel of Mark does not give any infancy narrative or genealogy like Matthew or Luke, nor a theological foreword like John. It jumps straight in with a declaration that Jesus is the Son of God and almost immediately begins to explore his ministry.
